Marino Regini is Professor of Economic Sociology and Vice-Rector of the University of Milan. Also, he is the director of the Italian Centre for Research on Universities and Higher Education Systems (UNIRES).

He has been a graduate student in Sociology at Columbia University and the University of California in Berkeley and has been a visiting professor at several Universities, including Harvard and the MIT.

He serves or has served on the Editorial Boards of the Socio-Economic Review, European Sociological Review, European Journal of Industrial Relations, among others. His current research focuses on institutional change in European higher education.
